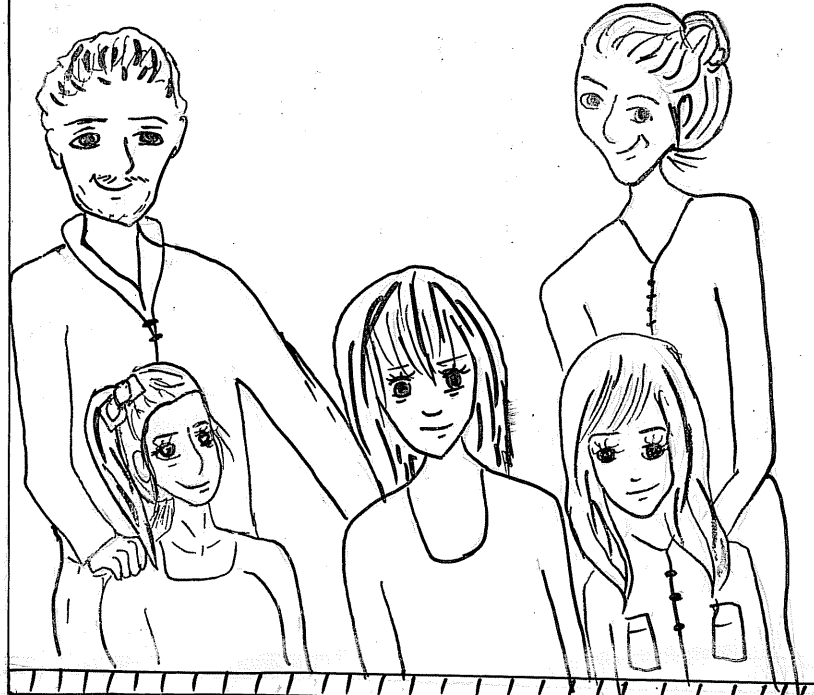


This my family in Nepal, and we are

Camp in Nepal.





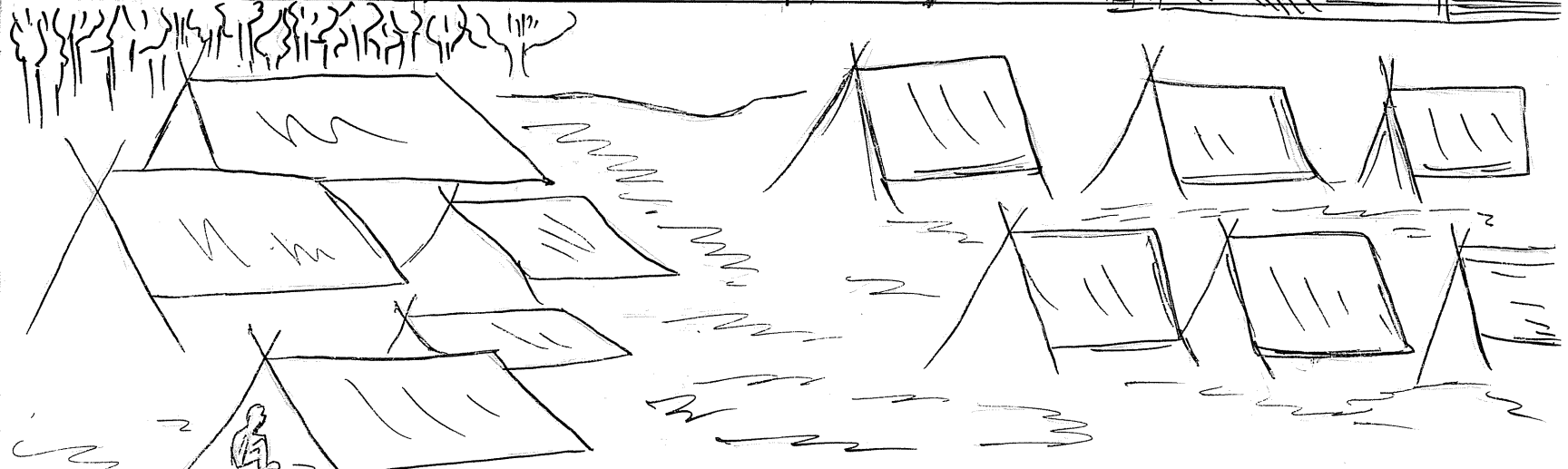
Sometimes the camps had flooding.



Sometimes there were fires.

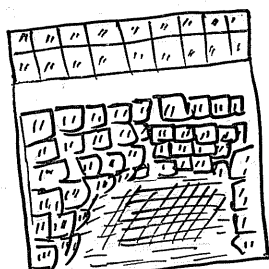
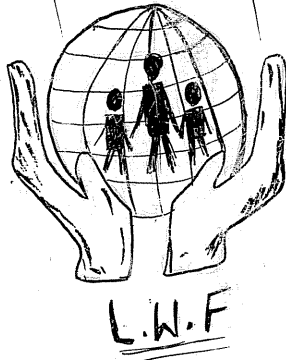
I need some more water

Wow, America!!

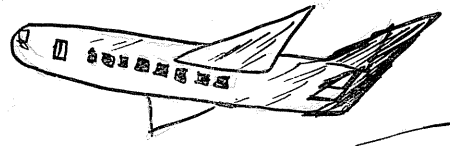
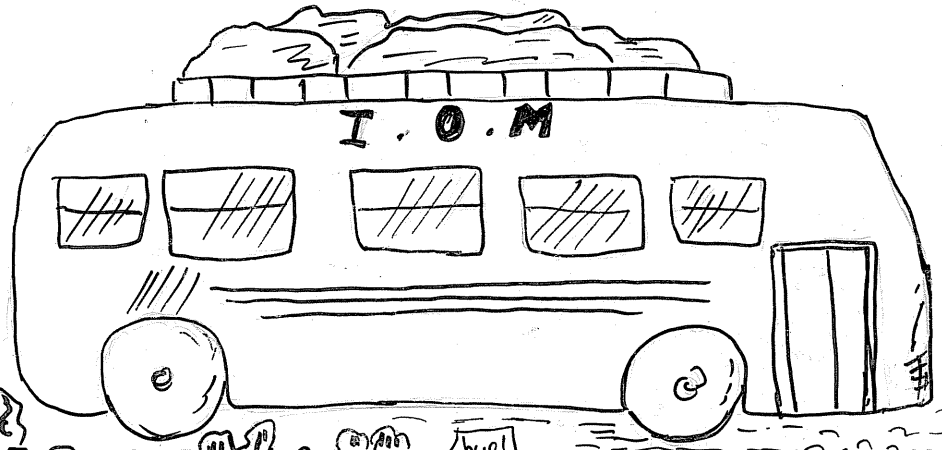
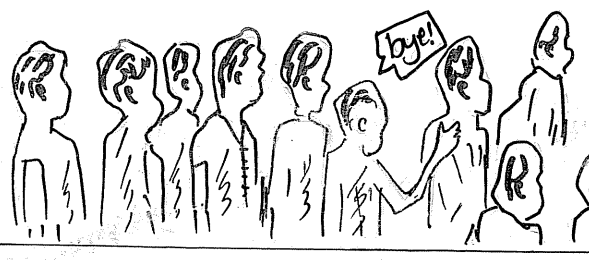
Mom, dad we wanted to move to America. We want that our children's future will be bright and happy. So, I want my children should decide to move to America but, not to other country. ???
