Enrollment update: We have 228 students; need 12 more to make budget Hiring update (no mental health therapist)—we had only one applicant for the half time position. She was excellent but decided not to leave her current full time job. We will reopen it later and consider making it full time.

Aaron Metcalfe of Hogan Construction (helpful in renovating the school when it opened) asked us to consider exploring a move to a new site on the Meadowbrook Campus as part o a larger project serving refugees. The board unofficially agreed to move ahead with this exploration, without any commitments.
