



Expectations for Utah International Students

Respect Yourself. This includes...

- No alcohol, tobacco, or drug use anywhere, any time.
- Dress appropriately for school.

Respect Others. This includes..

- Follow directions of teachers and school staff.
- Speak with respect and kindness to everyone.
- No swearing in any language.
- Handshakes and high-fives only...no other touching.
- Absolutely no violence.
- Clean up after yourself and use equipment and materials responsibly.
- No chewing gum in the building at any time.

Respect Learning This includes...

- Attend school every day, unless you are sick.
- Get to class on time and ready to learn.
- Stay on campus during school hours.
- Do your best in class and on homework, and ask for help when you need it.
- Don't use electronic devices during class.

Possible Consequences for Rule-Breaking

- Meet with teacher
- Meet with principal
- Make restitution
- Lunch detention, lunch cleanup
- After school detention or work detail
- Meet with parents
- Suspension in or out of school
- Expulsion from school

Expectations for Parents and Guardians

- Make sure your child gets to school on time each day.
- Call the school by 9:00 AM if your child is sick.
- Pay attention to communication from the school.
- Remind your child to keep up on homework.
- Meet your child's teachers (parent conferences and other events).
- Check on your child's progress (SIS, report cards, conferences).
- Volunteer and participate in events at the school as much as you can.

Utah International Computer and Internet Acceptable Use Policy

Utah International students will use computers and the internet at school to support their learning. They will receive a school email account and will be taught how to use it appropriately. In order to use computers and the internet at school, students must agree to the following rules:

1. Don't use the internet, school computers, or your school email account for illegal activity of any kind.
 - a. Don't copy other's material without proper citation.
 - b. Don't harass, threaten or annoy others.
 - c. Don't try to access mature or obscene materials.
2. Don't damage, disrupt, or waste school computer and technology resources.
3. Don't share passwords or use other people's accounts.
4. Don't try to get access to restricted sites, or to damage or vandalize someone else's data.
5. Don't use internet games unless instructed to do so by a teacher.
6. Don't provide your personal contact information on the internet unless instructed by a teacher.
7. Don't use services that have a fee or charge.
8. Don't use school computers, internet, or email for money-making purposes or for religious or political lobbying.
9. Don't download music, video, or other files that are not part of a school assignment.
10. Use your school email account to communicate with teachers and staff.
11. Don't use your school email account for any purpose that is against school rules or these acceptable use policies. Your school email account is the property of the school.

If you misuse your computer, email, or internet privileges, you will lose them and may also face other consequences.

School computers are for education! Be respectful, use good judgment, and if you aren't sure if something is OK, ask your teacher.
